

The Terry Town Council met in special session for the purpose of working on the budget for fiscal year 2019-20 and consideration of forming a Streets Committee. The following persons were in attendance: Council members Cindy Bond, Caryn Rein, and Peter Leyva, Clerk Lynn Schilling, Neva Rathbun, Donne Stagg and Dustin Stagg. Mayor Rolane Christofferson presided over the meeting.

Mayor Rolane Christofferson called the meeting to order at 6:03 p.m. and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Council Member Peter Leyva discussed his idea for forming a Streets Committee. He stated that it would be an advisory committee of individuals with applicable knowledge and recommendations. He further stated that they would have no formal authority, they would solely be formed to advise and support the governing council. They would also serve as liaisons for the community and to help research and communicate efforts. He would like to be a part of the group, to serve as the facilitator of the group and the committee would consist of 4-5 people. Mayor Rolane Christofferson stated they would further discuss at a regular meeting with the town's attorney available to weigh in as well.

The Town Council continued reviewing previous years' expenditures and established expenditure line item amounts for the upcoming budget year. Clerk Lynn Schilling stated that she would need to reach out to Stahly Engineering for guidance on budgeting for the sewer fund as it is unknown what may be occurring with the wastewater improvements in the coming fiscal year. Clerk Lynn Schilling also provided them information on the past year's revenues as well as proposed revenues for the upcoming fiscal year.

The Town Council reviewed information that Clerk Lynn Schilling prepared reflecting 2 and 2.5 % COLA increases for employees. The county's COLA will be at 2.59 % this year. Council Member Caryn Rein stated that she felt Mayor Rolane Christofferson deserved a raise with the increasing demands of her position as Mayor.

Council Member Peter Leyva discussed PubWorks. He was able to negotiate a lower price for what he felt the Town would need. He has also talked to Dawson County about their experiences with the program and received positive feedback.

Having no further comment, questions, or public comment the meeting was adjourned at 7:55 pm. (Rein/Bond)
